Helen Baczynski

Helen began machine quilting in 1998 with her Gammill Premier. Over the years she has added the IntelliStitch stitch regulator and IntelliQuilter computer to her machine. She has been associated with Kasa Engineering, who make both I/S and IQ, since 2002 and travels throughout the western U.S. installing I/S' and IQ's on longarms. She began teaching IQ related classes in 2007 and has travelled to shows in the U.S and overseas to teach.

Linda began teaching children and adults basic quiltmaking in 1999, and IntelliQuilter classes in 2009, and is the author of several IQ workbooks for the IntelliQuilter System of Computerized Longarm Quilting. Linda is currently serving as Vice President on the board of the National Quilting Association.



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Location

Classes will be held in the lower level of the Sheraton Hotel and in the lower level of the Overland Park Convention Center. Packet pickup will be near the Courtyard 1 classroom in the convention center beginning on Sunday.

Registration

You may register for as many classes as you feel comfortable taking in a two-day period. Keep in mind with this pre-show conference you will not be distracted by wanting to shop the vendor mall or look at the quilts! There are 2-3 class options during each class session plus the full day Bootcamp each day. Bootcamp is a two-day session with in-depth instruction from the beginning. Demo classes will have a quilting machine with an IQ installed and will have a camera projecting onto a screen. Hands-on tablet classes will require you to bring your tablet to follow along in class. Art & Stitch classes will require that you have a laptop with at least the trial version of the software installed prior to class.

The registration fee will cover IQ classes as well as additional classes should you decide to take classes during the remainder of the week of the show. Your name badge will be your admission ticket to the vendor mall and quilt show opening on Wednesday, May 16 at 3 PM.

Registration for classes will begin on December 1, 2011 at noon central time, if you are a current member of IMQA and on January 2, 2012 at noon central time for non-members.
